Need to Know

- Certified bike hotels offer services especially for cyclists, from special athletes' breakfasts, tips and information relevant for cyclists and mountain bikers to bike-related services such as store rooms and repairs.

- Almost all local trains provide a luggage van to transport your bike. For long-distance trains (IC or EC), look for bicycle symbols next to the train number. You will need an additional ticket to transport your bike in the luggage van.

Try riding an e-bike. These battery-powered bikes allow visitors of all fitness levels to enjoy a relaxed pedalling experience.

Perfect for Mountain Bikers



With more than 720 km of mountain biking trails, 480 km of valley cycle paths for more relaxed tours, a top-rated biking park, biking schools and bike-friendly infrastructure, **Saalfelden Leogang** is the ultimate biking paradise in SalzburgerLand.

The neighbouring region of **Saalach Hinterglemm** also offers more than 400 km of clearly signed bike trails for all levels of ability. The Joker Card gives you free



or discounted entry to many attractions in the region, including cableways that transport you and your bike to the top of the mountain.

Perfect for Leisure Cyclists

Said to be the most popular and beautiful cycling path in Europe, the **Danube Cycling Path** stretches out over 370 km along the Danube riverside - from Passau all the way to Vienna. This easy cycling path can be done in stages, is excellently signposted and largely traffic-free, making it ideal for families.



Cycle through the Wachau region, a UNESCO World Heritage Site famous for its wine, and spot magnificent buildings like the UNESCO Melk Abbey in Melk along the way. Enjoy the view from the ruins of Dürnstein fortress and discover outstanding museums in Linz, the 2009 European Capital of Culture.
