Culture. Who is that?

The 2024 cultural year in Upper Austria. 200 years of Anton Bruckner and Bad Ischl Salzkammergut as the European Capital of Culture.

Upper Austria is the land of 1.5 million cultural ambassadors. They all are culture. And they all make this province so special. They are well-known beyond our borders, like Parov Stelar, the creator of electro swing, singer-songwriters Avec and Ina Regen or star conductor Franz Welser-Möst and world musician Hubert von Goisern. Or the St. Florian Boys' Choir, young musical ambassadors travelling the world representing Upper Austria. They are active in hundreds and thousands, in one of the 478 music bands in the region, in numerous cultural initiatives and associations. They turn Upper Austria into this wonderful cosmos of culture that is worth experiencing and discovering.

Diverse cultural scene

At the SBAM Festival in Linz, Austria's largest pop-punk-rock festival, the new music festival LIDO Sounds in Linz, the "Woodstock of Blasmusik," Europe's largest brass music festival and the "INNTöne Jazz Festival," contemporary music takes centre stage. Cultural ambassadors perform on the stages of the State Theatre and the Music Theatre in Linz, as well as at numerous festivals, from the Lehár Festival in Bad Ischl to the Music Festival in Steyr and the Salzkammergut Festwochen in Gmunden. Many places like Hallstatt and the Danube Limes bear the UNESCO World Heritage label, while the capital city Linz — with the Francisco Carolinum as a centre for media art and the Ars Electronica Center hosting its annual festival in autumn — is a UNESCO City of Media Arts. These elements shape the cultural identity, alongside the rich museum tradition in the region, where, in addition to hotspots like the Lentos Art Museum or the Marmorschlössl in Bad Ischl, it's quite possible for art enthusiasts to open a museum - as seen with the Museum Angerlehner in Thalheim bei Wels or the Schütz Art Museum in Engelhartszell, the world's first ZERO ENERGY ART MUSEUM. Experiences of industrial culture, innovative craftsmanship built on traditional knowledge and impressive architectural gems complement Upper Austria's diverse cultural offerings.



The year 2024 shines with its two cultural beacons far beyond the borders of the region: the 200th birthday of the composer and organ virtuoso Anton Bruckner and the European Capital of Culture, Bad Ischl Salzkammergut 2024. The Bruckner anniversary is a welcome occasion to present Upper Austrian culture in all its diversity, which will be expressed in numerous projects in villages, towns and cities across Upper Austria. In 2024, the Salzkammergut region aims to prove, under the motto "Kultur ist das neue Salz" (Culture is the new salt), that an alpine region with 23 municipalities can come together as a "Cultural Capital Region" for the first time. Furthermore, in 2024, Wolfgangsee Lake celebrates the 1,100th birthday of its patron saint.

Becoming the European Capital of Culture

The programme of the European Capital of Culture, Bad Ischl Salzkammergut 2024, is growing and thriving. It's a programme fuelled by international impulses that bring new voices and perspectives to the Salzkammergut region. Throughout the year 2024, with some programme elements already in 2023, over 150 projects will be experienced across the Salzkammergut region — a colourful and thought-provoking mixture of regional initiatives and international artists, combining artistic performances and discourse with a sustainable approach, respecting tradition while looking towards the future.



"Culture is the new salt"



The Salzkammergut region offers a rich tapestry of fascinating stories, places and people set in a breath-taking landscape. Shaped by the elements of salt, water and wood, this region has a multifaceted history. It all began 7,000 years ago in Hall-statt when the story of salt mining started. Salt trade has sustained, enriched and internationally connected the region. It attracted the wealthy and powerful to its lands, and with the concept of "Sommerfrische" (summer retreat), the Salzkammergut became a highly sought-after destination. The historical cultural landscape of the Inner Salzkammergut is now a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Programme themes

The programme of the European Capital of Culture, Bad Ischl Salzkammergut 2024, is organised around four main themes, each highlighting possibilities for actively shaping our future:

- *Power and tradition*: Understanding and respecting the dynamics of power and tradition is crucial for comprehending the transformation of local and global identities.
- *Culture in flux*: Embracing cultural change is fundamental. It allows for innovation, making a region and its society strong and future-oriented.
- Sharing Salzkammergut: This theme, "Sharing Salzkammergut The Art of Travel," explores the diverse challenges and opportunities for the high-quality development of tourism.



• Globalocal — Building the New: The aim is to shape rural alpine regions to enable a rural lifestyle while staying connected and engaged globally.

In 2024, the title "European Capital of Culture" is awarded to an inner-alpine, rural region for the first time in history. The town of Bad Ischl, together with 22 other municipalities in Upper Austria and Styria, is creating a cultural region that reinvents itself through the collaboration of art, culture, business and tourism.

Anton Bruckner — the province becomes the stage

Upper Austria, its people and their mentality is characterised by a unique blend of tradition, avant-garde and innovation. This distinctive mixture defines the essence of Upper Austria: tradition and avant-garde coexist harmoniously. It means being aware of the land one inhabits while remaining open to the new and the different. Anton Bruckner serves as a guiding star for this specific balance. Like no other composer of the 19th century, he was deeply rooted in the history and craftsmanship of music.



Upper Austria was Anton Bruckner's homeland. He was born in Ansfelden in 1824 and received his musical upbringing, nurturing and education at the nearby St. Florian Monastery. In Linz, he evolved into a celebrated organ improviser and a composer with a distinctive musical language. Today, his music resounds in the Brucknerhaus Linz, the concert hall named after him. He is the namesake of the Bruckner Orchestra Linz, and his legacy lives on at the Anton Bruckner Private University, where teaching and research continue to thrive.



Wolfgang Year 2024

In the coming year, Wolfgangsee Lake will celebrate the 1,100th anniversary of its patron saint. This birthday will be celebrated grandly, together with the approximately 150 Wolfgang-related locations in Central Europe. The saint, known for his social commitment, is said to have thrown his axe from the mountain into the valley to find a place to build a church, which became the present-day Pilgrimage Church of St. Wolfgang. For centuries, thousands of pilgrims from all directions came to visit St. Wolfgang. Today, the "Wolfgang Paths" are still walked and all lead to the same destination: the hermitage on Falkenstein and the church he built in St. Wolfgang. Numerous events, such as the Art Circle International, where guests can watch artists at work, pilgrimages "In the Footsteps of St. Wolfgang" or the "Wolfgangspiel am See," a music theatre piece specially written for the 1,100th birthday of St. Wolfgang, are taking place. From 24 May to 22 June 2024, this performance will be presented on a unique mobile stage on the lake. Titled "Wolf — The Mystical," the play explores the profound questions of human existence and delves into the life of St. Wolfgang.

The essential elements of life, salt and water have been enduring factors in the Salzkammergut region throughout history and continue to be so today.
